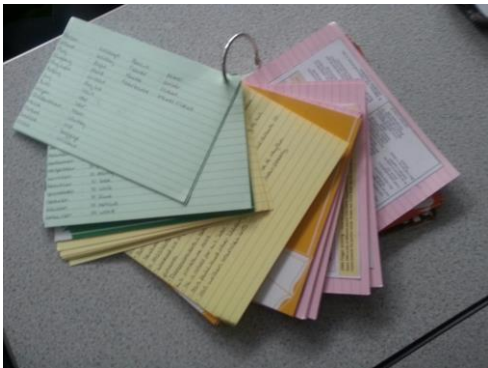




Here are some ideas, students can revise in lots of ways as long as it helps!

How can I help my child revise?



Flashcards are really useful for:

- Kay facts, dates, names
- Short explanations
- Use different colours for different topics

Tip: Use their revision cards to test them on the facts



GCSE Pod/Youtube is really useful for:

- Revisiting the important points
- Checking understanding against notes already made

Tip: Watch the podcast and write down 5 key points. See how many can be remembered later that week. Watch again!

Past Papers

- Answer past questions
- Do these in timed conditions
- Use the mark schemes

Tip: Plan and revise the topics and then answer the question in the time you need.



Working as a group:

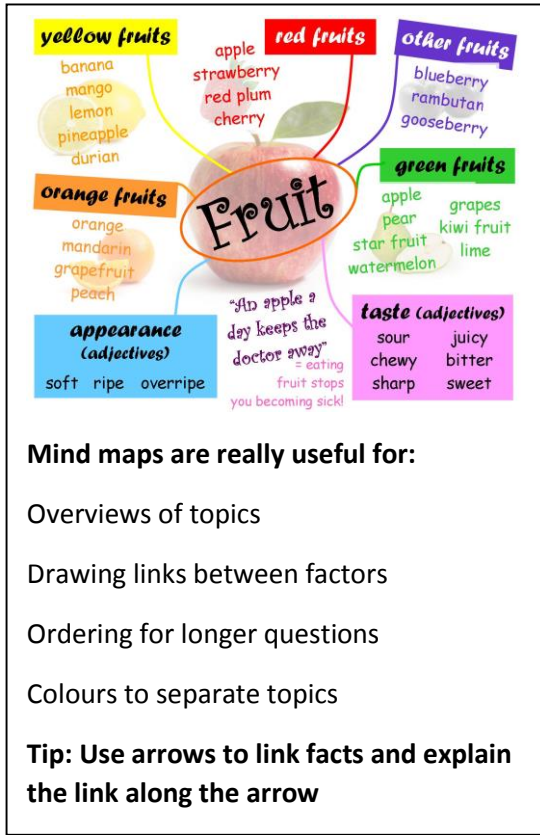
- Students work together to teach each other topics.
- Read each other's answers and discuss what could make them better.
- Test each other on facts.

Tip: Divide the topics and then share notes and explain to each other

Avoid distractions when revising.

Don't look at your phone when revising or watch TV.

Keep focussed for a small time then do these things.



Mind maps are really useful for:

- Overviews of topics
- Drawing links between factors
- Ordering for longer questions
- Colours to separate topics

Tip: Use arrows to link facts and explain the link along the arrow
