#### Parent Survey

Thank you to all parents who completed the parental questionnaire. We wanted to get feedback from parents about a number of areas and the feedback will be useful to help inform us of aspects of our work that we can develop further.

Overall the feedback was very positive with the following results:

- 90% of parents say their child is happy at the school.
- 96% of parents say their son feels safe at school.
- Less than 2% of parents say their child had been bullied and it was not dealt with by the school.
- 94% of parents agree that their child has the opportunity to take part in clubs and extracurricular activities in school.
- 92% of parents agree that their child does well at school and that behaviour is good in school.
- 87% of parents say that when they have raised issues that these have been dealt with.
- 87% of parents say that the school has high expectations.
- 88% of parents who completed the questionnaire said they would recommend the school.

An area of the survey that parents have asked for more information on is around what their child studies. This information will help you see what your child is learning in each of those subject areas over the course of the year. These should be a useful source of information for you and we will continue to look at ways we can keep you informed about the programmes of study the students are engaged with.

Thank you to parents who took the time to provide comments as well. These again have been really useful for us to look at what areas we can develop further. There were no consistent themes through the comments, but we will look at the feedback and utilise this in informing how we can continue to improve.

## Winter Health Update on behalf of Public Health

Winter health update - January 2023
For parents/carers and education and childcare settings

As children return to schools and childcare settings, we expect to see many more cases of flu, COVID-19 and other infections that affect children's breathing (known as 'respiratory infections'). There also continue to be high numbers of scarlet fever cases, which can spread quickly, but can be easily treated with antibiotics. To help us through this term, this leaflet has five simple steps we can take to protect children, minimise the spread of illness in schools and childcare settings and protect others.

# 1. Stay home if unwell

Infections can spread quickly in schools and other childcare settings. If your child is unwell and has a fever they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and their fever has gone. Adults should try to stay home when unwell and consider wearing a face covering to protect others if you do have to go out. Don't visit people in hospitals or care homes if you have a fever, a cold or symptoms of a stomach upset.

# 2. Keep hands clean

It is important to help children understand that keeping hands clean can stop bugs from spreading. Help your child wash their hands regularly at home with soap and warm water.

#### 3. Catch coughs and sneezes

Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is a simple way to help stop illness from spreading. Keeping rooms well ventilated will also help prevent the spread of winter illness.

## 4. Get vaccinated if you're eligible

Now is a good time to check you and your family's vaccinations are all up to date. If you are unsure your child has had all their routine vaccinations, you can check their personal health record (Red Book) or ask your GP. You can also check the childhood immunisation

schedule online. And it's not too late to get the free NHS flu jab or nasal spray this year if anyone in your family is eligible. The NHS will be contacting parents of children who have not yet had their flu immunisation. Flu nasal spray clinics are still taking place in some schools this month, or for children aged 2-3, please contact your GP to arrange an appointment.

#### 5. Be scarlet fever aware

Call your GP for advice if you think your child has scarlet fever. More information about scarlet fever can be found on the NHS website.
