What has happened in your area since January?

East Herts -Welcome to parents and carers of St Andrew's primary in Hertford, who have just joined the project, we will be in touch via the school after Easter to share how you can input.

St Joseph's school shared their 'You Said, We Did' feedback and had their first coffee morning with ADD-vance. A coffee morning was also held for St Catherine's parents and carers, which again was attended by ADD-vance. Focus groups were held for parents and carers of The Sele School and Richard Hale.
